Health Guarantee/ Buyer's Contract

Congratulations on the ownership of your new puppy from Flying S Labradors! We are committed to sending you home with a happy healthy pup as well as providing continued support though the years as your puppy's new owner.

Buyer in this contract refers to the purchasing party, _____

FSL in the contract refers to Flying S Labradors.

FSL makes the following guarantee to you regarding the Labrador puppy you are purchasing.

- Your puppy is guaranteed to be in good health at the time of your purchase. Good Health is defined in this guarantee as, to be free of serious illness or genetic defects that will shorten your dog's life.
- 72 Hour (3 day) Guarantee. This dog is guaranteed to be in good health, to the best of my knowledge at the time of this sale, and has had initial inoculations against distemper, hepatitis, para/parvo virus and received worming. The buyer has **three business days** from day of purchase in which to have the dog checked by a licensed veterinarian, and is urged to do so. If in this time frame, mortality should happen to the above mentioned puppy, the cause of which is clearly hereditary in nature (**this does not include presence of parasites**), a money refund will be given for 3 day guarantee of mortality, **provided a letter** from the examining veterinarian is offered as proof of life threatening illness. It is agreed and understood that any exchanges must be made within the **three day guarantee** period.
- Your puppy will be free of any life threatening, congenital or hereditary defects for a period of 120 days from the puppy's date of birth.
- Lifetime guarantee that your puppy will be free of the following diseases known to Labradors: EIC (Exercise-Induced Collapse), DM & CNM (Degenerative Myelopathy & Centronuclear Myopathy), PRA/prcd (Progressive Retinal Atrophy) and Cystinuria.
- A vaccination list and worming schedule will be sent home with the Buyer at the time of possession.

Terms of the Limited Health Guarantee:

1. The buyer agrees to have the puppy examined by a licensed veterinarian at the Buyer's expense within 3 business days from the date of possession. If the veterinarian does not give the dog a clean bill of health, buyer must notify the seller immediately. Seller reserves the right to have the dog reexamined by a veterinarian of FSL's choice at FSL's expense.
2. Any condition that is minor, correctable, or a breed related minor condition is not covered and any condition which will go away as the puppy gets older is not covered.
3. FSL will not accept responsibility for any harm that comes to the puppy once in the Buyer's possession such as accidents, electrocution, heat related conditions or any other related actions. Seller does not accept responsibility for contagious diseases diagnosed after 3 days from the date of possession.
4. The puppy must not have been bred, suffered from over feeding, obesity, trauma, misuse, neglect or intense training prior to full development occurring at 18 months of age
5. The buyer must provide written notice to FSL within 72 hours of discovery for any genetic defect or serious illness that alters the life of the puppy.
6. Within 10 days of discovery, a licensed veterinarian must provide written documentation directly to FSL or FSL's chosen veterinary service confirming the defect or illness.
7. The puppy must be returned to FSL within 10 days of the notification at the buyers' expense.
8. FSL reserves the right to have the puppy examined by a licensed veterinarian of its choice at the expense of FSL. Should there be a discrepancy between the buyers and FSL's licensed veterinarian's findings, FSL's veterinary findings shall control.
9. Should any of the above-enumerated terms not be met, the limited Health Guarantee will be held void.

Serious illness and genetic life altering defects do not include: umbilical hernia, external or internal parasites or bacteria, coccidiosis, giardia, undescended testicles, inverted vulva, under bite or over bite. The preceding list of illnesses and defects are not an exhaustive list. FSL also does not make any guarantee regarding the puppy's personality or disposition although we take measures to insure your puppy has been well socialized and exposed to as many sights, textures and sounds as possible before sending them home with you. ***This guarantee is valid only for original owner and is non-transferable. No guarantee is made at time of sale regarding show, hunting, or breeding prospects of the puppy.***

By the signing of this contract, you, the buyer accepts and understands all conditions written within. This contract contains the entire purchasing and health agreement between the buyer and the FSL and no statement or verbal agreements made by either party not contained within this written contract shall be valid or binding. This contract may not be modified or altered except in writing and signed by both parties. Any legal matters before the court shall be done in the court of the county that FSL resides.

Return Policy:

If at any point, you are unable to care for your dog, please do not hesitate to bring him / her to us. There is no drop-off fee, and we will ensure your dog goes to another safe and loving home to live out the rest of its days.

Health Care:

Your puppy needs a series of vaccines given to protect them against canine distemper, canine hepatitis, Parainfluenza, and Parvovirus. Our licensed veterinarian has given them the first series of vaccines. The next vaccines are due at 9, 12 and 16 weeks. Your puppy will also get their rabies vaccine at age 16 weeks. Heartworm preventive should also be given monthly (Consult with your veterinarian). This health guarantee is null and void if the vaccination schedule is not followed according to this schedule and vaccinations are given by any person other than a licensed veterinarian.

Socializing:

You need to **limit your puppy's exposure prior to receiving all of their vaccines.** Do not take them to dog parks or let them down on the floor in a pet store. However, it is very important to socialize your dog for their first 16 weeks if you want a well-rounded dog. Our mutual goal is to introduce them to as many new sights, sounds, smells and stimulation as possible without putting them in a situation where they are exposed to health risks.
